**CASE MANAGEMENT CONFERENCE:** A Case Management Conference will be set within 150 days of filing the complaint.

**ALTERNATIVE DISPUTE RESOLUTION (ADR):** THE COURT ENCOURAGES YOU TO CONSIDER UTILIZING VARIOUS ALTERNATIVES TO TRIAL, INCLUDING MEDIATION AND ARBITRATION, PRIOR TO THE CASE MANAGEMENT CONFERENCE. PARTIES MAY FILE THE ATTACHED STIPULATION TO USE ALTERNATIVE DISPUTE RESOLUTION (SDSC FORM #CIV-359).

18 Plaintiff TRI-CITY HEALTHCARE DISTRICT ("Plaintiff" or "the District") alleges as  
19 follows:

20 **THE PARTIES**

21 1. Plaintiff is a local hospital district duly organized and existing under the Local Health  
22 Care District Law, codified at California Health and Safety Code §§ 32000-32492 and, at all times  
23 mentioned herein, is and was authorized to establish, maintain, and operate health facilities or health  
24 services in the State of California.

25 2. Defendant THE SAN DIEGO UNION-TRIBUNE, LLC ("SDUT" or "Defendant") is,  
26 and at all times mentioned in this complaint was a limited liability corporation organized under the  
27 laws of the State of Delaware, with its principal place of business in the County of San Diego,  
28 California.



1 Act request. The request asked for all emails sent from the District's CEO that mentions or relates to  
2 the SDUT news organization or its reporters.

3 9. Beginning on or about September 12, 2011, and continuing to the present time, the  
4 SDUT wrongfully and unlawfully infringed upon the District's right to assert its right to and prevent  
5 the use and disclosure of information and documents protected by the attorney-client privilege  
6 delineated in Evidence Code section 954 and Government Code section 6254(k).

7 **FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION**

8 **(Injunctive Relief against SDUT and DOES 1-35)**

9 10. Plaintiff re-alleges and hereby incorporates by reference as though set forth in full,  
10 Paragraphs 1 through 9 of the Complaint.

11 11. Defendant's wrongful conduct and threatened wrongful conduct, unless and until  
12 enjoined and restrained by order of this court, will cause great and irreparable injury to the District  
13 as it will disclose privileged communications protected under California law. Publication of the  
14 privileged communications will enable the District's competitors to have access to its thought  
15 processes, thus giving them an unfair competitive advantage. Additionally, publication will reveal  
16 the District's litigation tactics and strategy.

17 12. Plaintiff has no adequate remedy at law for the injuries as it will be impossible for it  
18 to determine the precise amount of damage that it will suffer if the SDUT publishes and/or continues  
19 to use the privileged communications.

20 **SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION**

21 **(Conversion, Replevin, and Specific Recovery of Personal Property**

22 **against SDUT and Does 1-35)**

23 13. Plaintiff re-alleges and hereby incorporates by reference as though set forth in full,  
24 Paragraphs 1 through 12 of the Complaint.

25 14. At all times herein mentioned, Plaintiff was, and still is, entitled to possession of  
26 the privileged communications inadvertently given to Defendant on September 12, 2011, which is  
27 Plaintiff's tangible property.



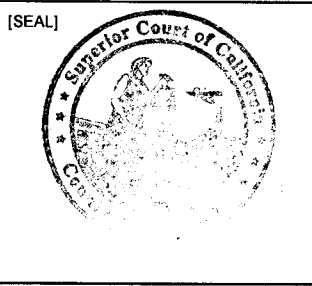

This information will be used to compile statistics about the types and numbers of cases filed. You must complete items 1 through 6 on the sheet. In item 1, you must check one box for the case type that best describes the case. If the case fits both a general and a more specific type of case listed in item 1, check the more specific one. If the case has multiple causes of action, check the box that best indicates the primary cause of action. To assist you in completing the sheet, examples of the cases that belong under each case type in item 1 are provided below. A cover sheet must be filed only with your initial paper. Failure to file a cover sheet with the first paper filed in a civil case may subject a party, its counsel, or both to sanctions under rules 2.30 and 3.220 of the California Rules of Court.

**To Parties in Rule 3.740 Collections Cases.** A "collections case" under rule 3.740 is defined as an action for recovery of money owed in a sum stated to be certain that is not more than \$25,000, exclusive of interest and attorney's fees, arising from a transaction in which property, services, or money was acquired on credit. A collections case does not include an action seeking the following: (1) tort damages, (2) punitive damages, (3) recovery of real property, (4) recovery of personal property, or (5) a prejudgment writ of attachment. The identification of a case as a rule 3.740 collections case on this form means that it will be exempt from the general time-for-service requirements and case management rules, unless a defendant files a responsive pleading. A rule 3.740 collections case will be subject to the requirements for service and obtaining a judgment in rule 3.740.

**To Parties in Complex Cases.** In complex cases only, parties must also use the *Civil Case Cover Sheet* to designate whether the case is complex.
